Professor Croasdale I am honored to present this award, named for you, in appreciation of your many years of distinguished service to Dartmouth College.

Professor Croasdale was an undergraduate student at the University of Pennsylvania, also receiving her Ph.D. There in 1935. That same year she became a research assistant in the Dartmouth College Department of Physiology. Two years later she joined the Zoology Department and over the years compiled a record of distinguished research.

IN 1964 PROFESSOR CROASDALE WAS THE FIRST WOMAN TO RECEIVE TENURE IN THE FACULTY OF ARTS AND SCIENCES. IN 1971, Dr. CROASDALE, WAS NAMED PROFESSOR OF BIOLOGY EMERITUS; HOWEVER, SHE CONTINUED TO TEACH AND STILL IS ACTIVELY ENGAGED IN RESEARCH.
