I should like to make one more effort to have the status of Dr. Hannah Croasdale clarified and put on a basis consistent with her professional training and reputation and her contributions to the College. I should appreciate it if you and your departmental colleagues would give consideration to the possibility of recommending that Dr. Croasdale's title be that of "Associate in Zoology" with the "rank of Assistant Professor." The "rank of Assistant Professor" is a rank that has been used in the past to give faculty status to members of the College staff whose work directly supports the teaching program without involving class room teaching, as for example, Miss Ellen Adams, Assistant Librarian, has the rank of Assistant Professor. In view of Dr. Croasdale's professional background and length of service at Dartmouth, I wonder if it would not be appropriate to accord to her the same recognition that we have given to Miss Adams?

If, after reviewing this matter, the departments have no objection to giving this recognition to Dr. Croasdale, I should appreciate having a joint memorandum, making the recommendation for the consideration of the Committee Advisory to the President. This need not be done immediately, but we should like to present any recommendation that is to be made to the Board of Trustees next spring. I shall be glad to talk the matter over with you if you desire further clarification.
